Landline and cell phone interviews conducted May 13-14, 2015.


### **Sampling Error**

Plus or minus 5% at the 95% confidence level.



### **Voter Mood**

Voters throughout the state and in most subgroups say right direction.





"Generally speaking, do you approve or disapprove of the job Brian Sandoval is doing as Governor?" (Q2)








### **Financing Education Reforms**







There is majority consensus that large casinos don't pay their fair share and plurality consensus that big businesses don't pay their fair share.




